

# **Sport Premium Funding 2022/23**

### **Harston & Newton Community Primary School**

Current numbers on roll (nor) Reception - y6 = 120

Number of children in Reception and Years 1 – 6 who were eligible for Sport Premium on the January 2022 School Census = 109 (£10 premium per child)

Funding received: £17,090 (£16,000+£1,090) - £704 deficit carried over from 2021/22 = £16,386 to spend for 2022/23.

#### **Background:**

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding was to be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding was for the period September 2013 to August 2015 and was then extended for September 2015 to August 2017. This was then doubled for September 2017-August 2020 and has now been extended until 2025. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make an impact in Physical Education, School Sport & Physical Activity (PESSPA) in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PESSPA provision, however it must be for things that are in addition to what would normally be provided for as part of curriculum PE & staffing and be linked to one of the 5 key indicators listed below.

#### The 5 Key Indicators for P.E.:

- 1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and physical activities offered to all pupils
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport


