

Sport Premium Funding 2021/22

Harston & Newton Community Primary School

Current numbers on roll (nor) Reception – y6 = **128**

Number of children in Reception and Years 1 – 6 who are **eligible** for Sport Premium on the January 2021 School Census = 113 (£10 premium per child)

Funding received: £17137 + £3310 carried over from 2020/21 = **£20,447**

Background:

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. The funding is for the period 1 September 2013 – 31 August 2014 & September 2014 to August 2015 and was then extended for September 2015 to August 2017. This was then doubled for September 2017-August 2020 and has now been extended until 2021. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of. It must however be for things that are in addition to what would normally be provided for as part of curriculum PE and staffing.

During the academic year September 2021 to July 2022 we have spent or allocated our funding in the following areas (Covid-19 has impacted some of this):

- Subscription package purchased from the South Cambs School Sports Partnership*
- Specialist sports coaches to facilitate extra-curricular clubs
- Releasing our Primary PE Specialist to support leadership and competition and resulting supply costs
- Subject Leader planning & CPD and resulting supply costs
- Sports equipment & PE resources to aid the delivery of inter-house competition and physical activity
- Cross-Curricular Orienteering program to help increase physical activity through active learning opportunities

**The South Cambs School Sports Partnership (SCSSP) is a 'not for profit' organisation based at Comberton Village College. They work closely with schools across South Cambridgeshire to support them in raising whole school standards in Physical Education and School Sport. The SCSSP also has extensive links with partner organisations who can provide enhanced opportunities for schools.*
