The choir director told us that we were among some of the first people to hear a selection of songs which will be performed at this year's Christmas Eve Carol Service. We also had the chance to join in with some singing and

were challenged to see if we could be louder than the organ - not an easy task! It was a delightful morning and one that the children will remember for a long time to come.



### Reception and Key Stage 1 Nativity

### Class Amethyst to STEM

On Friday 12th December Amethyst Class visited the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) centre in Stevenage. Our science topic on Forces was enhanced by the chance to build our own balloon cars, which work by applying Newton's Third Law of Motion. We also had plenty of time to explore the science experiment room, containing many pieces of equipment that demonstrated science and engineering concepts. The most popular was the charged

plasma sphere, which (if handled correctly) could transmit a tiny electric current through a person's hairs - either on the arm or inside the nose! After lunch, Scientist Ranvir gave us a detailed briefing on the designs and purposes of the Mars Rovers being built there and we saw some of the prototypes being tested on the simulated Mars landscape. Finally, we were enlightened by a talk concerning Newton's other laws of motion - featuring a few "Don't try this at home" explosive demonstrations! A great day out was had by all.



### West Road Charity Concert

Humming & Notes, our school choir, along with their friends Tongue Twisters and VoxPop, performed at this event with the best singing they have ever done! It was truly amazing! We started with *Believe* a beautiful song from the film *Polar Express* with wonderful harmonies and added bells! We continued with *Tu Scendi Dalle Stelle*, an Italian carol all about the response to the baby Jesus being born, sung beautifully and in Italian! This was followed by *Counting Down to Christmas*, a fun upbeat song and we closed with *Thankful Heart*; a well-loved track for *The Muppets' Christmas Carol*, but very wordy! 
### **Mini Athletics Santa Dash**

## **Sports Reports**

### **Yr 3/4 Friendly Football match**

On Monday 24<sup>th</sup> November I travelled to Trumpington Park Primary School with a team of children from Emerald Class to take part in two short friendly Football Matches against their Red and Blue teams. After a quick warm up we began the first match against Trumpington Blues. It got off to an exciting start and there were plenty of chances at both ends keeping the goalkeepers on their toes. Joseph was first in goal for Harston and he did well to make a couple of good saves and was well supported by Hugo and Oliver in defence. Rhys, Matty and Stirling battled hard in midfield to get the ball to Felix who tried to reach the net. We rotated positions to mix things up a bit bringing on Junn-Ninn in midfield and Ethan in defence. Matty moved to centre midfield and had a great shot at goal, unfortunately it just tipped over the top of the goal post. Harston continued to put pressure on the defence but the Trumpington Blues managed to score a goal minutes before the final whistle.

Harston were undeterred by their first defeat and began the second match against Trumpington Reds very strongly. Hugo went into goal for the first half and Oliver and Joesph were a very capable duo in defence. Rhys worked hard in midfield alongside Felix and Junn-Ninn and drove the ball forwards. Matty did lots of running and his fitness really shone through. Harston had most of the possession and were looking likely to score. We had one final switch of positions and moved Stirling into Goal Keeper with Ethan and Joseph supporting in defence. Hugo was instrumental in driving the ball forwards to Felix who scored a fantastic goal. The attack was keen for another goal but sadly time didn't allow. Well done to all the children who played in the match. The attitude and behaviour of the children was excellent and they all shook hands with the opposition at the end of the match. It was nice for the children to see Mr Cox who congratulated

them on their win. Thank you to the parents who helped with lifts and came to support the team it is very much appreciated. I hope to arrange another friendly match in the Spring.



### **Small Schools Cross Country**

On Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December we set off to Milton Country Park with 33 children from KS2 to take part in the Small Schools Cross Country Event. The weather conditions were perfect, blue skies and a crisp winters day with plenty of muddy puddles on the course. Children raced in their year groups against children from 18 other small Schools in fields of approximately 100. Year 6 were the first age group to race and there were lots of speedy runners on the course, so the competition was tough. Blake was the first Year 6 Boy to cross the finish line within the top 20 finishers. Daisy had a spectacular run with a fast first lap that catapulted her into second place. The Harston crowd were cheering her on and waiting by the finish line to see her hold onto the position and finish in second place. Next it was Year 3 Boys and Rhys was first back from Harston with an impressive top 20 finish. The Year 3 Girls started off well and Emma sped off to the front and held her pace all the way round the course finishing in 5<sup>th</sup> position which was fantastic. The Year 4 Boys set off with Matty up at the front hoping he could go one better than his second-place finish last year. He held onto the lead and did a spectacular sprint finish to a roaring Harston crowd. The Year 4 Girls were up next and they all ran a well-paced race with Ula crossing the line in 11<sup>th</sup> position and the others were all closely

behind. Finally, it was Year 5's turn to race after waiting patiently and cheering on the other runners. We only had 3 Girls running from Year 5 but they all ran a steady race with Emily being the first Harston girl to cross the finish line. Dany had a good first lap and on his second lap he picked up the pace overtaking lots of other runners and finishing in 7<sup>th</sup> position followed closely by Ofri who ran a great race. I really enjoyed watching all of the children running and am incredibly proud of them all for showing determination and commitment. What really stood out was the excellent behaviour and the support that all the children showed to each other by watching each team race and cheering them on. Thank you to Ms Evely and Mrs Jones for accompanying us and all of the parent helpers who volunteered on the day.

The first event was 25m freestyle with Charlotte representing Harston and Newton. Charlotte sped her way to the end with a fantastic front crawl technique and finished in third position.

Aydan competed in the 25m Backstroke race working hard to power his arms and legs and finishing fourth. Saven competed in the 10m freestyle race. He showed great determination and finished in first place. Leo M took part in the 10m race using a noodle and showed that he had an efficient leg kicking action resulting in him finishing in third place. Alfie D participated in the 10m noodle travelling on his back speeding to a first-place victory. After the individual races the children took part in some relays and team challenge activities. Charlotte and Saven took part in the 2 x 25m Freestyle Race finishing in third position. Sophia-Rose, Max, Aydan and Leo B completed the 4x10m relay, they worked well as a team and finished in fourth position. The final challenge activities were the slam dunk shuttle race where each child had to swim 10m with a pall and pass it to the final team member who tried to score a basket,

Alfie had a good shot on target. The raft race involved each child taking an object to the raft and then the whole team pushing the raft back to the side. Sophia-Rose was determined to swim to the raft as quickly as possible allowing her team to come second. The treasure hunt was a timed activity where each swimmer in the team had to collect as many objects from the bottom and top of the pool as possible. At the end of the gala children were awarded with medals and certificates for participating. The children behaved impeccably being extremely patient waiting for their turn to compete on poolside. Special thanks to Charlotte and Max from Amethyst Class who were excellent role models and supported and encouraged the other children.
